Sunday, August 11, 2024 Scripture: Luke 22:1-6



THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

The sin of betrayal is a work of the devil that twists all that is good and results in division, brokenness, and the destruction of life; but the gospel of Jesus Christ makes all that is crooked and broken new again.

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION (Use along with Reading: Ante Faciem Dei)

- 1. What does it mean to fear people rather than God (verse 2)? What are the consequences? Is this an issue in your life?
- 2. When it comes to the topic of demonic activity, are you prone to an unhealthy interest or functional denial? How does Scripture combat both extremes (Jude 9; Daniel 10)?
- 3. What was the source of Judas' plan to betray Jesus (verse 3; 1 Peter 5:8)? Why is it impossible for a Christian to be possessed by a demon (Ephesians 1:13-14)? In what other ways does Satan attack Christians, and how can we be on guard against his devices (Ephesians 6:10-20)?
- 4. Discuss how betrayal is self-seeking, devalues others, and ultimately leads to death (verses 4-5; James 1:14-15).
- 5. How had the sin of betrayal distracted Judas and the religious leaders from the important season for the nation of Israel (verses 1-2)? Is there sin in your life that captivates your time and attention?
- 6. Does the demise of others evoke celebration or sorrow in you?
- 7. Have you experienced betrayal from someone you love? Explain how the gospel of Jesus is the remedy we need in these moments of pain and suffering.
