Scripture: Esther 7:1-10



THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

The Lord preserves His people by laying down his life for them, and he destroys His enemies.

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION (Use along with Reading: Ante Faciem Dei)

- 1. How does Esther begin her request and why (verse 3a, Exodus 33:12-13)? What can we learn from Esther's negotiation tactics?
- 2. Why did Esther indicate that she had remained silent if her people were sold into slavery (verse 4)?
- 3. What was the value proposition in her request (verse 4)?
- 4. How does the Jewish people's situation and Esther's unique position, along with her godly wisdom, foreshadow Jesus' mediatorial work?
- 5. What is the basis of our favor with God? What fate do we share with our Mediator, and how does that truth impact your daily life?
- 6. How did God act on his people's behalf through Queen Esther's interaction with the king?
- 7. Discuss ways we more resemble Haman than the "heroes" of this story.
- 8. What satisfied the king's wrath?
- 9. Although Jesus has defeated our enemies, why do we continue to struggle daily? How can we live faithfully in preparation for his return?
