## THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

The love of God leads to life, no matter the difficulties faced; and sin always leads to death, no matter the pleasure.

## QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION (Use along with Reading: Ante Faciem Dei)

- 1. Contrast the Bible's definition of "blessed" with the world's? Does it negate hardship and agony in life?
- 2. How can we know whether we are being tested by the Lord or tempted? Does it change how we respond?
- 3. Discuss the difference between "trials" and "temptation" as James uses them.
- 4. What are the three characteristics of the one who remains steadfast under trial (verse 12)?
- 5. What is the prize for a lifetime of endurance, and how do we endure to the end? Discuss the connection between our love for God and endurance.
- 6. What trial are you undergoing that God is using to teach you how to love Him more? Share a time you secretly, openly, or unwittingly blamed God for the hardship in your life.
- 7. Why can James be confident that God is never the source of temptation?
- 8. Explain how profound theological truth, particularly about the nature of God, is always immensely practical for life.
- 9. What is the natural lifecycle of sin as James defines it, and how does Jesus break the cycle?

## **GOSPEL OBSERVATIONS**

- A heart transformed by the gospel, evidenced in growing love for God, is what gives believers the strength to endure to the end.
- The gospel reveals that God is good and pure in all he does.
- Our sinfulness is deeper and darker than we often realize. The gospel is stronger and brighter than we understand.
